JOB SUMMARY

A **Foster Volunteer** provides temporary care for animals that are underage, underweight, recovering from illness or injury, or need extra socialization before they're ready for adoption.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Care of Foster Animals

- Provide food, clean living space, socialization, enrichment, and grooming for foster animal(s)
- Administer medication as needed (instructions provided by the Veterinary/Foster Team)
- Ensure the safety and well-being of foster animals, separating them from household pets at all times
- Observe and monitor foster animals closely, tracking weight and symptoms, reporting any medical or behavioral concerns promptly
- Transport foster animals to and from the shelter for check-ups, vaccinations, and evaluations

Other:

- Maintain a clean and safe environment for foster animals
- Bottle-feed and/or syringe-feed puppies and/or kittens who are in need of additional nutritional support (additional training provided by the Veterinary/Foster Team)
- Take on additional tasks as needed to support the success of the foster program

QUALIFICATIONS

٠

- Minimum age of 13 years old with active adult guardian participation
 - If under 18 years old, a parent or adult guardian must attend orientation, handle communication regarding appointments, and handle transport
 - Students are eligible for community service hours
 - Animal handling experience preferred, but not required
- Ability to communicate effectively and efficiently via email
- Ability to follow Pet Alliance policies & procedures
- Must be comfortable communicating in English to ensure clear interactions with staff, visitors, and fellow volunteers, Bilingual volunteers are welcome

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL DEMANDS

- Ability to lift up to 25+ lbs
- Strong reading, writing, and communication skills in English
- Good vision, hearing, quick reflexes and decision-making skills for safe handling of animals

WORK ENVIRONMENT

- Most responsibilities take place in the volunteer's home
- Visits to the shelter may include exposure to a noisy and warm kennel environment
- Moving between rooms/buildings may expose you to temperature and humidity changes
